**Open Response Structure - 1 Paragraph** 

Follow the following step-by-step structure of open responses.

Prompt: How do Sherlock and Watson differ in "A Study in Scarlet?"

# 1. TAG + TTQA + YOUR ANSWER TO THE PROMPT + Reasons = Thesis Statement

Example: In Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's novella, "A Study in Scarlet," Sherlock and Watson differ because of their areas of expertise, personality traits and social skills.

\*In open responses, your thesis statement should be the FIRST sentence of your response.

#### 2. Use a transitional word/phrase and state first reason.

Example: The first way Sherlock and Watson differ in "A Study in Scarlet" is through their interests because Sherlock is an expert in observation and deducing clues, while Watson's background is in medical training for the army.

\*Notice how the reason mentions the prompt (how Sherlock and Watson differ), and also gives a to-the-point reason.

# 3. Use a transitional word/phrase to introduce an example of text evidence to prove your reason.

Example: For example, in the text it says, "......" about Sherlock and "....." about Watson.

\*The prompt will dictate how many pieces of text evidence you will need to provide.

### 4. Give a brief sentence of analysis.

Example: These pieces of text evidence show that although the two men are partners and friends, their areas of expertise are different.

\*Your analysis should be very brief, but should explain how your text evidence proves or is connected to the thesis.

### 5. Repeat steps 2-4 for your 2nd and 3rd reasons.

### 6. Concluding sentence that re-states thesis.

Example: In conclusion, Sherlock and Watson differ in "A Study in Scarlet" because of their areas of expertise, personality traits, and social skills.

\*In open responses, your thesis statement should be the FIRST sentence of your response.

\*Notice how the reason mentions the prompt (the mood of the story), and also gives a to-the-point reason.

3. Use a transitional word/phrase to introduce an example of text evidence to prove your reason.

Example: For example, in the text it says, "......" (pg. \_\_\_\_)

4. Give a brief sentence of analysis.

Example: This shows that the mood is frightening because...

\*Your analysis should be very brief, but should explain how your text evidence proves or is connected to the thesis.

- 5. Repeat steps 2-4 for your 2nd and 3rd reasons.
- 6. Concluding sentence that re-states thesis.

Example: In conclusion, the mood of "The Adventures of the Speckled Band" is frightening.
